## **Our initial observations**



- The data supporting the SUMP gives a measure of the mobility – modal split, origin-destination, economical efficiency
- The plan works very slow
  - Depends a lot on local funding and needs time for people to ajust
- Having a SUMP is still awsome:
  - Vision objectives actions
  - Stakeholders and mobility changes
  - EU grants (from the Commission, from the Regional Programes)
  - Has parking



# **See what has changed over time**

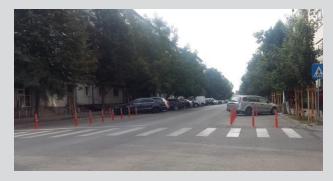
### What we discovered



- The pandemic forced part of the population to shift towards the car
- The mobility changed (eScooters, eBikes, Bikes, EV)
- Parking behaviour and management reaction changed



Before – illegal and abusive on-street parking Source: Google.com/maps/



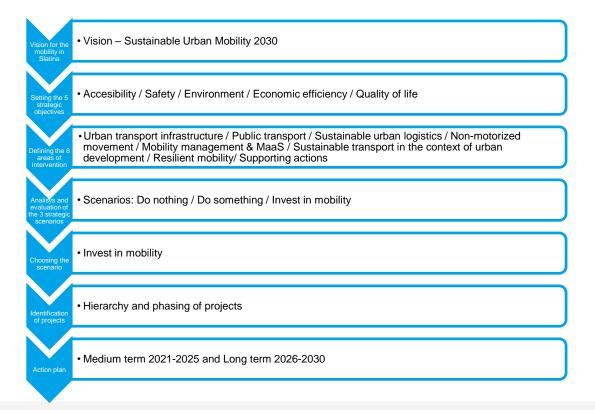

# Do not treat any as a special kid

## Parking is part of the solution



- Parking management is part of the urban mobility and part of SUMP 2.0 (and so is ParkPAD)
- Manage the off-street parking to allow space for people and non-motorized mobility
- All aspects of the mobility need atention, not just roads or EV etc.
- Change the modal split by 2023 / 2030
